Re: National "Slow Down" Day – 7.00 hrs Friday 21st October to 7.00 hrs Saturday 22nd October 2016.

An Garda Síochána will conduct a national speed enforcement operation "Slow Down", supported by the Road Safety Authority and other stakeholders for a 24 hour period from 07.00 hrs on Friday 21st October to 07.00 hrs on Saturday 22nd October 2016.

Although 2015 saw a very welcome reduction in road deaths, resulting in 162 road deaths, the joint lowest on record, there has been a marked increase in road deaths in 2016. Excessive and inappropriate speed is a major contributory factor in road traffic collisions, further confirmed by the recent RSA report on fatal collisions between 2008 and 2012 which found that excessive speed was a contributory factor in one third of all fatal collisions during that time. The higher the speed, the greater the likelihood is of a collision happening and the more severe the outcome of that collision. As a general rule a 1% reduction in average speed will bring about a 4% reduction in fatal collisions, and this is why reducing motorists' speed is essential to improving road safety.

The objective is to reduce the number of speed related collisions, save lives and reduce injuries on our roads. The aim of "Slow Down" is to remind drivers of the dangers of

speeding, increase compliance with speed limits and act as a deterrent to driving at excessive

and inappropriate speed.

The operation will consist of high visibility speed enforcement activities as well as the

delivery of a road safety message through the use of national and local media. In addition,

Garda personnel will provide display stands in key venues to provide road safety advice and

distribute road safety leaflets.

Furthermore, I ask that you take the opportunity to circulate the key message to "Slow

Down" to all employees and contractors, through all communication mechanisms open to

you, including internet, intra-net, and social media, and, whether driving for business or

private purposes, to always drive within the speed limit and at a speed appropriate to the

prevailing conditions.

Drivers are also asked to turn dipped headlamps on to show support and increase their

visibility.

Garda website and social media sites.
